



## FASTEST FINGER FIRST

The Home Office has released details of its proposed rule changes from 1 July 2021. There have been some changes to the acceptable documents for proving a right to take up work in the UK.

These changes are listed in the new 'List A' and 'List B'.

**Q:** From 1 July 2021, will EU citizens be able to work in the UK using a passport or identity card?

**A:** Our panel said 'No. EU citizens will need to be registered on the EU Settlement Scheme and provide a share code'.

**Q:** What will happen if an employer employs someone who is not allowed to undertake work even if they carry out all required document checks?

A: Your colleague has correctly answered they will not hold a statutory excuse and could be liable for civil penalties of up to £20,000. If they knowingly permit someone to work when they are not allowed to, this is a criminal offence.

UK Birth Certificates and NI or Current Biometric Residence Permits (BRP)?
